







How Much Fake News Are They Spreading?




Trump Support

study.




Resistance

Everyone Else


The rest of the tracked groups were responsible for only 6% of the fake news, with Democratic Party and Local News accounts sharing none.

How Much Fake News Are They Spreading?




Hard Conservative

58% of the fake news shared on Facebook came from hard conservatives, who shared news from 91% of the fake news sites.



Democratic Party

The second-biggest sharers of fake news on Facebook, Democratic Party accounts shared 12% of the fake news from 40% of the fake sites.



Occupy

Facebook accounts associated with the Occupy Wall Street/Occupy movement shared 7% of the fake news seen during the course of the study.




Public Health

The only group to NOT share fake news on Facebook were the accounts identified as belonging to public health organizations.
